JOINT ENABLING CAPABILITIES COMMAND

The U.S. Joint Forces Command (USJFCOM) Joint Enabling Capabilities Command (JECC), established on Oct. 1, 2008, serves as the USJFCOM subordinate command responsible for the employment, management and development of USJFCOM joint enabling capabilities (JEC) for global response force execution and other tasks to enhance joint force command and control. These capabilities provide unique mission ready support to joint force commanders to aid in the accelerated formation and increased effectiveness of their headquarters.

Headquartered at the Joint Warfighting Center in Suffolk, Va., the JECC combines capabilities across the seven unique functional areas of plans, operations, logistics, knowledge management / information superiority, communications, public affairs and intelligence and consists of the Joint Deployable Teams (JDT), the Joint Communications Support Element (JCSE), the Joint Public Affairs Support Element (JPASE) and the Intelligence - Quick Reaction Team (I-QRT).

The JECC deploys its capabilities in the form of a specifically tailored standard JEC package, which consists of 77 personnel from each of the JEC elements. Every three months, a ready JEC package (RJP) assumes an alert-posture and this package is ready to deploy within hours.

The JECs:

- Rapidly deliver tailored, mission-specific support within hours of notification
- Provide trained, responsive and cohesive capabilities to assist in the rapid standup of a JTF HQ
- Act as the operational arm of USJFCOM HQ via the global response force execute order
- Use a "total force" active component / reserve component mix



JOINT DEPLOYABLE TEAMS

The JDTs consist of up to 45 individuals (24 active, 21 reserve) who possess experience in the planning and execution of joint military operations. The JDT is a flexible employable package composed of personnel from the four unique JECs of operations, plans, knowledge management / information superiority and logistics and is tailored to specific mission requirements.

JDTs are not individual augmentees but rather a team of readily deployable and experienced joint planners and operators.



JOINT COMMUNICATIONS SUPPORT ELEMENT

The JCSE is composed of joint active duty, guard and reserve personnel that can globally deploy within hours of notification to provide command, control, communications and computers support to geographic combatant commands and U.S. Special Operations Command.

JCSE can provide communications packages tailored to the specific needs of a full JTF HQ and to a joint special operations task force. JCSE has the unique ability to solve communications and interoperability problems between services, coalitions and host nation partners.



JOINT PUBLIC AFFAIRS SUPPORT ELEMENT

The JPASE provides the warfighter with a trained, equipped, scalable and expeditionary joint public affairs capability to support world-wide operational requirements. JPASE is an early entry capability that enables the joint force commander to gain and maintain the initiative in the information domain.

JPASE has three related functional areas:

- Expeditionary public affairs support for operations
- Proponency
- Training support



INTELLIGENCE - QUICK REACTION TEAM

The I-QRT provides military and civilian intelligence professionals with targeting and collection management expertise to a JTF within hours of notification or during events leading up to a crisis or contingency operation.

A deployed I-QRT consists of up to four targeteers and four collection managers that are highly trained individuals and maintain specific qualifications in their respective areas of expertise and are tailored to support individual combatant command requirements.
